



ARTS AND SCIENCES AD HOC MAJOR IN BLACK AND LATINO STUDIES

Bachelor of Arts seeking students may pursue an interdisciplinary ad hoc major in Black and Latino Studies (BLS) since the department does not currently offer a major. BLS is fundamentally organized as interdisciplinary studies

Students can embark upon an ad hoc major following preparation and acceptance of a proposal outlining the area of study, the desired outcomes, and the educational values of the program. The ad hoc major must be approved by the Office of the Associate Dean, Weissman School of Arts and Sciences.

The Weissman School of Arts and Sciences ad hoc major requires 30 – 33 credits.
