## Opportunities for Undergraduates

### Harry S. Truman Scholarship

The Truman Scholarship is a merit based grant of up to \$30,000, to eligible juniors who wish to pursue graduate studies in preparation for a career in government, the non-profit sector, or the public sector. Truman Scholars aspire to become a "change agent," in time, improving the ways that government agencies, nonprofit organizations, or educational institutions serve the public.

### Public Policy and International Affairs (PPIA) Fellowship, Junior Summer Institute

The PPIA Junior Summer Institute is a 7 week program structured to introduce or strengthen skills in economics, statistics, policy analysis, writing, public speaking and organization/time management. Fellows go on to complete master's degrees in Public Affairs, Public Administration or International Affairs.

## Opportunities for Post-Graduation

### U.S. Fulbright Program

Grants for U.S. citizens to pursue international graduate study, to serve as an English Teaching Assistant (ETA), or to conduct independent research projects. Several Fulbright awards are available in Public Affairs/Policy.

**Australia:** Anne Wexler Master's Award in Public Policy; **Italy:** Master in Public Administration at SDA BOCCONI Award; **UK:** UCL Executive Masters in Public Policy Award; **Netherlands:** Erasmus University Rotterdam, Suzana Rodrigues Award; **Singapore:** Urban Planning & Sustainable Design Award. Candidates can also apply in Public Affairs/Policy fields to any eligible country to pursue projects of their own design.
