Opportunities for Undergraduates

Jeannette K. Watson Fellowship

Provides internships, mentoring, and enriched educational opportunities to promising NYC students. Fellows receive paid internships for three consecutive summers. In the course of the program, Fellows are encouraged to sample work in at least two of three sectors: nonprofit organizations, government service, and private enterprise.

Harry S. Truman Scholarship

A merit based grant of up to \$30,000, to eligible juniors who wish to pursue graduate studies in preparation for a career in government, the non-profit sector, or the public sector. Truman Scholars aspire to become a "change agent," in time, improving the ways that government agencies, nonprofit organizations, or educational institutions serve the public.

Humanity in Action Fellowship

Fellows participate in an annual human rights fellowship program held in Amsterdam, Berlin, Copenhagen, Paris or Warsaw. The fellowship brings together international groups of students to explore national histories of discrimination and resistance, as well as examples of issues affecting different minority groups today.

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship

International study is intended to better prepare U.S. students to assume significant roles in an increasingly global economy and interdependent world. Over 2,300 scholarships of up to \$5,000 will be awarded each year for study abroad during winter, summer or semester sessions with award amounts varying depending on the length of study and student need.

Applicants must be a New American (a green card holder or naturalized citizen if born abroad; a child of naturalized citizens if born in this country).

Offers fully funded summer language institutes for U.S. university students. Knight-Hennessey Scholars

Each year a group of 100 high-achieving students from around the world with demonstrated leadership and civic commitment, from a wide array of backgrounds, will receive full funding to pursue a graduate education at Stanford University in any discipline. Gates Cambridge Scholarships

They are awarded to outstanding applicants from countries outside the UK to pursue a full-time postgraduate degree in any subject available at the University of Cambridge. Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship

Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange for Young Professionals

CBYX Participants spend a year studying and working in their career fields while completely immersed in German language and culture. The fellowship covers two months German language training, semester of study at a German university, five-month internship with a German company, accommodations, transatlantic airfare, monthly stipends, and insurance. www.cbyx.info
