Prestigious fellowships are nationally competitive merit-based awards providing funding opportunities to help students realize their goals. There are fellowships to fund study abroad; to fund professional development opportunities; to engage in the arts; to fund graduate school; and to do research. Applying for prestigious fellowships also creates an opportunity for self-reflection and critical thinking skill building.

**Fellowships in the Arts & Humanities**

There are many competitive fellowships that align with the goals of Arts & Humanities majors. Humanities students should particularly seek fellowships that fund study abroad, cultural exchange programs, and graduate study.

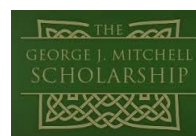

## Jeannette K. Watson Fellowship

A three year program providing funded summer internships and unprecedented opportunities to promising undergraduate students from NYC partner colleges. Fellows widen their view of the workplace and deepen their experience in fields of interest. Through diverse enrichment initiatives they develop their personal, professional, and cultural potential.

## Freeman-ASIA (Freeman Awards for Study in Asia)

Designed to support U.S.-based undergraduates with demonstrated financial need who are planning to study overseas in East or Southeast Asia. The program's goal is to increase the number of U.S. citizens and permanent residents with first-hand exposure to and understanding of Asia and its peoples and cultures.

## UK Fulbright Summer Institute

Special summer Institutes for U.S. citizens to come to the UK. These summer programs provide the opportunity for U.S. students, with at least two years of undergraduate study left to complete, to come to the UK on a three, four, five or six week academic and cultural summer program.

## Critical Language Scholarships

Fully-funded summer language institutes for U.S. university students. The program provides intensive overseas study in the critical need foreign languages of Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Portuguese, Russian, Swahili, Turkish, and Urdu.

## Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship

International study is intended to better prepare U.S. students to assume significant roles in an increasingly global economy and interdependent world. With this in mind, Gilman annually offers 2,300 scholarships of up to \$5,000 for study abroad during winter, summer or fall/spring semester sessions.

## Humanity in Action Fellowship

A summer program in Europe and the US exploring issues of democracy, pluralism, human rights, and social justice. Fellows are challenged to understand their host city's unique history of injustice, its present struggles to encompass groups with minoritized cultures and identities, and the future of its democratic values. After the summer, Fellows return home to develop Action Projects to address social justice issues in their own communities.

## Fulbright U.S. Student Program Arts Grants

Grants for U.S. citizens to pursue overseas graduate study, to serve as an English Teaching Assistant, or to conduct research projects. Several Fulbright awards are available in the Arts. **France:** Harriet Hale Woolley Awards in the Arts; **Hungary:** Liszt Ferenc Academy of Music Award; **Ireland:** The Hugh Lane Student Award at the Dublin City Gallery, University of College Cork Masters in Creative Writing; **Netherlands:** American Friends of the Mauritshuis Award; **Taiwan:** National Cheng Kung Univ. Master's Degree in Creative Industries Design; **UK:** John Wood LAMDA Award Masters in Classical Acting, Northumbria Univ. Award in Art & Design, Trinity Laban Award in Music & Dance, the Manchester Metropolitan Univ. Award in Creative Writing, the Univ. of Roehampton Award in Dance, and the Univ. of St. Andrews Award in Arts & Humanities. *Candidates can also apply in Arts & Humanities fields to any country to pursue projects of their own design.*

Full funding for Americans of high ability to study for a graduate degree in any field and at any university in the United Kingdom. The award covers tuition and fees, personal travel, book allowances, and provides a living stipend.

## The American-Scandinavian Foundation Fellowships

Fellowships and grants to individuals to pursue research or study in one or more Scandinavian country for up to one year. The number of awards varies each year according to total funds available. Awards are made in all fields. Applicants must have a well-defined research or study project that makes a stay in Scandinavia essential.

Recognizes and fosters intellectual achievement, leadership, and a commitment to community and public service. Up to twelve Mitchell Scholars between the ages of 18 and 30 are chosen annually for one year of postgraduate study in any discipline offered by institutions of higher learning in Ireland and Northern Ireland.
