Prestigious fellowships are nationally competitive merit-based awards providing funding opportunities to help students realize their goals. There are fellowships to fund study abroad; to fund professional development opportunities; to engage in the arts; to fund graduate school; and to do research. Applying for prestigious fellowships also creates an opportunity for self-reflection and critical thinking skill building.

Fellowships in Higher Education Administration

The program facilitates cultural exchange through direct interaction on an individual basis in the classroom, field, home, and in routine tasks, allowing the grantee to gain an appreciation of others' viewpoints and beliefs.

Future Leaders in Action (FLiA)

Fellows are placed with a community organization for 4 to 14 weeks. They work at partner organizations to implement and evaluate a program that supports youth in one of the following areas: Advancing Skills for Success, Promoting Public Health, Providing Enrichment Opportunities, or Environment Protection.

Fulbright International Education Administrators Program (IEA)

Fully funded opportunities for U.S. higher education administrators to participate intensive two-week seminars abroad to learn about other countries' higher education systems. Available to India, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, France and Germany.

Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education (NASPA) Graduate Associate Program (GAP)

An initiative to increase leadership opportunities of graduate students within NASPA. GAs work collaboratively with other GAs to become another communication conduit for NASPA events, publications, and programs offerings. GAs also have the opportunity to serve on an unofficial graduate student council, providing another perspective for NASPA student membership.

Harvard Univ. Administrative Fellowship

Provides participants with opportunities to enhance their professional experiences by both working within an academic environment as a mid-level administrator and working in an area that broadens and deepens previous opportunities. Fulbright English Teaching Assistantships (ETA)

Fulbright ETAs are placed in a classroom abroad to provide assistance to teachers of English to non-native Englishspeakers. ETAs help teach English while serving as cultural ambassadors for U.S. culture. Education Pioneers Fellowship

Offers a chance to explore a non-instructional career in education leadership. Fellows are connected with a high-impact placement opportunity at a leading education organization, where they can drive critical work on a defined project. Open to current graduate students or recent graduates. 10-week summer or 10-mth academic year opportunities available.

Partner Teachers also work towards a partially subsidized master's in education.
