What are Prestigious Fellowships?

Prestigious fellowships are nationally competitive merit-based awards providing funding opportunities to help students realize their goals. There are fellowships to fund study abroad; to fund professional development opportunities; to engage in the arts; to fund graduate school; and to do research. Applying for prestigious fellowships also creates an opportunity for self-reflection and critical thinking skill building.

Fellowships in Political Science & Law

There are many competitive fellowships that align with the goals of Political Science majors and/or students considering careers in Law. Examples are listed on the back. Students with these interests should particularly seek fellowships that fund government / political / legal internships, study abroad and those offering public service and policy making experiences.

Graduate school funding for eligible juniors pursuing careers as public service leaders. Truman aims to pick out people with the potential to envision positive change and then provide support to help them realize their aspirations. Public Policy and International Affairs (PPIA) Fellowship, Junior Summer Institute

A fully funded 7 week summer program offering rigorous academic graduate-level preparation and leadership development for juniors committed to public service careers. NYC Urban Fellows

Explores current urban issues through unique learning seminars and first-hand exposure to public sector leaders. CHCI Public Policy Fellowship Program

CHCI (Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute) Public Policy Fellows will spend 9 months working in Washington, D.C., with exposure to leaders in congressional offices, federal agencies, national nonprofit advocacy organizations, government-related institutes, etc. Fellows will immerse themselves in the legislative process learning all facets of public policy. The Rhodes Scholarship

Funding to complete a graduate degree at Oxford University in any field. Open to nationals of any country. www.rhodesscholar.org

Presidential Fellows Program

Provides collegiate students with the opportunity to study the federal policymaking process and the inner workings of the executive and legislative branches. Jeannette K. Watson Fellowship

A cohort-based program providing three consecutive funded summer internships and unprecedented opportunities to promising undergraduate students from NYC partner colleges. Fellows widen their view of the workplace and deepen their experience in fields of interest. Through diverse enrichment initiatives they develop their personal, professional, and cultural potential.

Fulbright U.S. Student Program

Funding for graduate study, to conduct research, and to teach English worldwide. The program facilitates cultural exchange through direct interaction on an individual basis in the classroom, field, home, and in routine tasks, allowing the grantee to gain an appreciation of others' viewpoints and beliefs.

Harvard Future Leaders in Law Program

A weeklong residential fellowship at Harvard Law School where Fellows engage with HLS faculty, staff, students, and alumni. During this weeklong residency and over the course of the yearlong program, participants will benefit from test and application preparation services, mentorship and networking opportunities, field trips, as well as academic and professional skills-building elements.

Samvid Scholars

Supports up to \$50,000 per year for two years of graduate study. In addition to funding for their graduate program, each Scholar will also receive two years of leadership development programming. Open to US Citizens and DACA Recipients. Graduate programs that are eligible for the program include: MD, MBA, JD, MPP/MPA, MPH, MS/MA in the social sciences or STEM.

Immigrant Justice Corps Community Fellowships

Fellows are trained over the 2-year program to become experts in immigration law and paired with leading non-profit legal services providers and community-based organizations in NYC and other states.
