What are National and Prestigious Fellowships?

Prestigious fellowships are nationally competitive merit-based awards providing funding opportunities to help students realize their goals. There are fellowships to fund study abroad; to fund professional development opportunities; to engage in the arts; to fund graduate school; and to do research. Applying for prestigious fellowships also creates an opportunity for self-reflection and critical thinking skill building.

Fellowships in Psychology

There are many competitive fellowships that align with the goals of Psychology majors. Examples are listed on the back. Students with these interests should particularly seek fellowships that fund research experiences, graduate school, study abroad and those offering public and community service opportunities.

- Provides a platform for you to create and articulate your intellectual, personal, and professional goals.
- Inspires early preparation for graduate school and other post-graduate opportunities.
- Provides you with experience in critical thinking, analytical writing, and oral presentation.

National Science Foundation Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU)

Provides funding for summer or semester long research participation by undergraduate students in any of the areas of research funded by the National Science Foundation. REU projects involve students in meaningful ways in ongoing research programs or in research projects specifically designed for the REU program. Donald and Vera Blinken FlexMed Program

FlexMed allows college sophomores in any major to apply for early assurance to the Icahn School of Medicine. Once accepted, students will be free to pursue their area of study, without the traditional science requirements and the MCAT.

National Institutes of Health (NIH) Undergraduate Scholarship Program

Offers competitive scholarships to students from disadvantaged backgrounds who are committed to careers in biomedical, behavioral, and social science health-related research. Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship

International study is intended to better prepare U.S. students to assume significant roles in an increasingly global economy and interdependent world. With this goal in mind, Gilman annually offers 2,300 scholarships of up to \$5,000 for study abroad during winter, summer or fall/spring semesters.

Fulbright U.S. Student Program

Funding for graduate study, to conduct research, and to teach English worldwide. The program facilitates cultural exchange through direct interaction on an individual basis in the classroom, field, home, and in routine tasks, allowing the grantee to gain an appreciation of others' viewpoints and beliefs.

National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship

NSF GRF awards are for students in NSF-supported STEM disciplines who are pursuing research-based master's and doctoral degrees at accredited US institutions. Fellows benefit from a three-year annual stipend along with an education allowance for tuition and opportunities for professional development.

APA Predoctoral Fellowship in Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services

Supports the training of practitioners in behavioral health services and prevention. APA Services for Transition Age Youth Fellowship

Supports the training of master's level practitioners in mental health services. Designed for students in terminal master's programs in psychology whose training prepares them to provide mental health services to transition age youth (ages 16 through 25) and their families.

Fellows are placed with a community organization for 4 to 14 weeks. They work at partner organizations to implement and evaluate a program that supports youth in one of the following areas: Advancing Skills for Success, Promoting Public Health, Providing Enrichment Opportunities, or Environment Protection.

Humanity in Action Fellowship

A summer program in Europe and the US exploring issues of democracy, pluralism, human rights, and social justice. Fellows are challenged to understand their host city's unique history of injustice, its present struggles to encompass groups with minoritized cultures and identities, and the future of its democratic values. After the summer, Fellows return home to develop Action Projects to address social justice issues in their own communities.
