Fulbright English Teaching Assistantships (ETA)

Fulbright ETAs are placed in a classroom abroad to provide assistance to teachers of English to non-native English-speakers. ETAs help teach English while serving as cultural ambassadors for U.S. culture. AIF Banyan Impact Fellowship in India

Funds and places for 10-months young professionals from the US in service with communities and organizations across India for mutual learning, capacity building, and leadership development in support of social justice. Fellows work on projects closely linked to Sustainable Development Goals and create sustainable impact through service and fieldwork across diverse thematic areas such as education, public health, livelihoods, social inclusion, minority rights, climate justice, etc.. https://aif.org/fellowship/

French Teacher Assistant Program (TAPIF)

Open to American citizens and permanent residents to teach English or a period of 7 months in public schools across all regions of metropolitan France and in its territories.
