



What are Prestigious Fellowships?

Prestigious fellowships are nationally competitive merit-based awards providing funding opportunities to help students realize their goals. There are fellowships to fund study abroad; to fund professional development opportunities; to engage in the arts; to fund graduate school; and to do research. Applying for prestigious fellowships also creates an opportunity for self-reflection and critical thinking skill building.

Fellowships in Public Administration

There are many competitive fellowships that align with the goals of public administration graduates. Examples are listed on the back. Students should particularly seek fellowships that offer professional development experiences within the public sector.

New York Opportunities

Empire State Fellowships

A full-time 2-year leadership training program that prepares the next generation of talented professionals for careers as NYS policymakers. The Governor's Office will appoint each Empire State Fellow to work directly with a Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner, or other high-level policy maker at a NYS agency or authority, or in the Executive Chamber. Requires 5 years work experience.

Excelsior Service Fellowship Program

Brings highly talented recent graduates of law, graduate, and professional schools in NY State into government service. Fellows work full-time for 2-years alongside senior members of the administration and play a policy-influencing role in NYS. Fellows serve in a variety of capacities within such agencies like the Dept. of Environmental Conservation, the Dept. of Labor, Housing and Community Renewal, the Dept. of Financial Services.

John D. Solomon Fellowship for Public Service

A 9-month fellowship for NYC resident graduate students who are specializing in emergency management, social work, public health, public safety, public policy or related field. Offers a paid fellowship in an agency of NYC gov.

NYS Senate Legislative Fellowships

Fellows are recent masters level graduates and are assigned to a Senate member for 9-months. Duties vary and depend on the needs of the member. Legislative Fellows generally perform in-depth policy research, meet with stakeholders, and attend legislative sessions.

NYC Housing & Planning Fellowship

A 2-year program for recent graduates, where fellows rotate through four six-month placements between HPD and HDC, learning firsthand about the City's efforts to revitalize New York City's neighborhoods through new construction; preservation; or neighborhood planning, etc.

Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship

Provides opportunities for U.S. early and mid-career professionals to serve in placements in a foreign government ministry or institution around the world. Fulbright Public Policy Fellows build mutual understanding and contribute to strengthening the public sector while cultivating public policy experience in their area of expertise.

Presidential Management Fellowships

A leadership development program at the entry level for advanced degree candidates. The Program is designed to develop a cadre of potential government leaders. The PMF Program inculcates a lasting bond as well as a spirit of public service, ultimately encouraging and leading to a career in the government.

CHCI Public Policy Fellowship Program

CHCI (Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute) Public Policy Fellows will spend 9 months working in Washington, D.C., with exposure to leaders in congressional offices, federal agencies, national nonprofit advocacy organizations, government-related institutes, etc. Fellows will immerse themselves in the legislative process learning all facets of public policy.

White House Fellows

Serve as a Fellow to senior White House Staff, Cabinet Secretaries, and other top-ranking government officials for 1 year. Fellows also participate in an education program consisting of roundtable discussions with leaders from the private and public sectors, and potential trips to study U.S. policy in action both domestically and internationally.
