Fellowships Requiring Baruch's Nomination / Endorsement



Applying for Baruch's Endorsement

The fellowships listed on this document require applicants to seek Baruch's nomination or endorsement to apply.

Some of the fellowships listed have limits on the number of applicants that Baruch can nominate to the sponsoring organization, while others have no limit on the number of applicants it can put forward for consideration. Either way, these fellowships require a campus review of all applicants to determine their eligibility for the fellowship, and to decide if a nomination/endorsement is warranted. Therefore, most of these fellowships have campus application deadlines that can fall weeks before the national deadline for the fellowship in order for Baruch to process applicants through a campus review.

Applicants intending to apply for these awards are encouraged to reach out to Baruch's Prestigious Fellowships Advisor as early as possible (using the below contact information) to indicate their interest to apply and to learn more about the relevant campus review process.

Opportunities for Undergraduates

Jeannette K. Watson Fellowship

A three-year program providing funded summer internships and unprecedented opportunities to promising undergraduate students from NYC partner colleges. Fellows widen their view of the workplace and deepen their experience in fields of interest. Through diverse enrichment initiatives they develop their personal, professional, and cultural potential. Baruch Deadline: Late January each year.

Harry S. Truman Scholarship

Graduate school funding for eligible juniors pursuing careers as public service leaders. Truman aims to pick out people with the potential to envision positive change and then provide support to help them realize their aspirations. Truman scholars, in time, aspire to improve the ways that public agencies serve society. Baruch Deadline: Late January each year.

Awards scholarships to college sophomores and juniors for leadership, public service, and commitment to issues related to Native American nations or to the environment. Baruch Deadline: Late February each year.

Opportunities to Fund Study Abroad

Boren Scholarships

Opportunities for undergraduate students to study abroad in areas of the world that are critical to U.S. interests and underrepresented in study abroad. The program focuses on geographic areas, languages, and fields of study deemed critical to U.S. national security. Baruch Deadline: Mid-January each year.

Boren Fellowships

Provides funding to add an important international and language component to a current graduate student's education through specialization in area study, language study, or increased language proficiency. Funding also available for undergraduates through the Boren Scholarship. Baruch Deadline: Mid-January each year.

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship

Enables American undergraduate students to gain proficiency in diverse languages and cultures, skills that are critically important to their academic and career development. Gilman annually offers 2,300 scholarships of up to \$5,000 for study abroad during winter, summer or fall/spring semester sessions. No earlier Baruch deadline.

Designed to support U.S.-based undergraduates with demonstrated financial need who are planning to study overseas in East or Southeast Asia. The program's goal is to increase the number of U.S. citizens and permanent residents with first-hand exposure to and understanding of Asia and its peoples and cultures. Opportunities for Post-Graduation

Fulbright U.S. Student Program

Funding for graduate study, to conduct research, and to teach English worldwide. The program facilitates cultural exchange through direct interaction on an individual basis in the classroom, field, home, and in routine tasks, allowing the grantee to gain an appreciation of others' viewpoints and beliefs. Baruch Deadline: Late September each year.

The Rhodes Scholarship

Provides full funding to complete a postgraduate level degree at Oxford University in any field. Rhodes Scholars are chosen not only for their outstanding scholarly achievements, but for their character, commitment to others and to the common good, and potential for leadership in their chosen career. Open to nationals of any country. Baruch Deadline: Early September each year. www.rhodesscholar.org

Marshall Scholarships

Full funding for Americans of high ability to study for a graduate degree in any field and at any university in the United Kingdom. The award covers tuition and fees, personal travel, book allowances, and provides a living stipend. Baruch Deadline: Early September each year.

George J. Mitchell Scholarship

Up to twelve Mitchell Scholars between the ages of 18 and 30 are chosen annually for one year of postgraduate study in any discipline offered by institutions of higher learning in Ireland and Northern Ireland. Baruch Deadline: Early September each year. www.us-irelandalliance.org/

James C. Gaither Junior Fellows Program

Knight-Hennessey Scholars

Each year a group of 100 high-achieving students from around the world with demonstrated leadership and civic commitment, from a wide array of backgrounds, will receive full funding to pursue a graduate education at Stanford University in any discipline. Their academic experience will focus on both subject-specific knowledge and leadership development to make an impact on the world. The KH Scholars program does not require a campus endorsement, but applicants can request one from Baruch and must do so by early September each year.
