


What are Prestigious Fellowships?

Prestigious fellowships are nationally competitive merit-based awards providing funding opportunities to help students realize their goals. There are fellowships to fund study abroad; to fund professional development opportunities; to engage in the arts; to fund graduate school; and to do research. Applying for prestigious fellowships also creates an opportunity for self-reflection and critical thinking skill building.

Fellowships in Liberal Arts / Social Sciences

There are many competitive fellowships that align with the goals of graduate students in the Weissman Sch. of Arts & Sciences. Examples are listed on the back. Students should particularly seek fellowships that offer cultural exchange, language learning and research experiences.

- Provides you with experience in critical thinking, analytical writing, and oral presentation.

Fellowships in Liberal Arts/Social Sciences

The American-Scandinavian Foundation Fellowships

Fellowships and grants to individuals to pursue research or study in one or more Scandinavian country for up to one year. The number of awards varies each year according to total funds available. Awards are made in all fields. Applicants must have a well-defined research or study project that makes a stay in Scandinavia essential.

The Luce Scholars Program

Provides full funding for early-career leaders in any field to engage in individually tailored and immersive professional experiences in Asia.

GenNext Fellowship

A two-year paid fellowship opportunity working with international humanitarian organizations CARE, Project Hope, Public Health Institute, Global Communities, and Save the Children. Fellows participate in a rotational structure that supports their foundational understanding of the humanitarian sector by being exposed to both the operational/support functions and the technical sub-fields that comprise the profession.

Critical Language Scholarships

The program offers fully funded summer language institutes for U.S. university students. The program provides intensive overseas study in the critical need foreign languages of Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Portuguese, Russian, Swahili, Turkish, and Urdu.

Boren Fellowships

Provides funding to add an important international and language component to a current graduate student's education through specialization in area study, language study, or increased language proficiency. Funding also available for undergraduates through the Boren Scholarship. www.borenawards.org/

Immigrant Justice Corps Community Fellowships

Fellows are trained over the 2-year program to become experts in immigration law and paired with leading non-profit legal services providers and community-based organizations in NYC and other states. Fellows become partially accredited representatives through the Department of Justice's Office of Legal Access Programs, allowing them to represent clients in legal matters before the Department of Homeland Security. https://justicecorps.org/community-fellowship/

Japan Exchange and Teaching Programme (JET)

Improves foreign language education in Japan and encourages international exchange at the local level by fostering ties between Japanese youth and foreign youth. Three types of positions offered: Assistant Language Teachers (ALTs), Coordinator for International Relations (CIRs), and Sports Exchange Advisor (SEA).

Fulbright U.S. Student Program

Funding for graduate study, to conduct research, and to teach English worldwide. The program facilitates cultural exchange through direct interaction on an individual basis in the classroom, field, home, and in routine tasks, allowing the grantee to gain an appreciation of others' viewpoints and beliefs.

Humanity in Action Fellowship

A summer program in Europe and the US exploring issues of democracy, pluralism, human rights, and social justice. Fellows are challenged to understand their host city's unique history of injustice, its present struggles to encompass groups with minoritized cultures and identities, and the future of its democratic values. Fellows return home to develop Action Projects to address social justice issues.

Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans

Provides funding for graduate study in any field at any advanced degree-granting institution in the United States. Each award could total of as much as \$90,000. Applicants must be a New American (a green card holder or naturalized citizen if born abroad; a child of naturalized citizens if born in this country).

AIER offers a variety of funded programs including paid internships in scholarly research, nonprofit programming, event planning, marketing, graphic design, communications, editorial writing, and fundraising. Future Leaders in Action (FLiA)

Fellows are placed with a community organization for 4 to 14 weeks. They work at partner organizations to implement and evaluate a program that supports youth in one of the following areas: Advancing Skills for Success, Promoting Public Health, Providing Enrichment Opportunities, or Environment Protection.
