- An overall Baruch GPA of at least 2.0 is required to declare a major.
- Students are allowed to double major in the Weissman School of Arts and Sciences.
- Students who complete two Weissman majors are not required to complete courses 2-4 of the College Option. You will only need to take a Great Works course.
- Students may complete two minors for their degree. If a student chooses to complete two minors, one of them may be an optional "business minor for non-business majors", offered by the Zicklin School of Business.
- 60% of the major units/credits must be completed at Baruch College.
- Students must complete at least 90 units/credits of Liberal Arts courses.
- Breaks in attendance may result in changes to your degree requirements.
- Under the College Option section, the liberal arts minor cannot be in the same area of study as the major. For
 example, an Actuarial Science major cannot declare the math minor; a Management of Music Enterprises major
 cannot declare the music or the music theory minors, etc. Students who have questions about possible major/minor
 combinations may contact the Weissman Dean's Office.
- Students cannot double major in statistics and one of the programs offered in the Math department (actuarial science, financial mathematics, or mathematics).
- An ad hoc major may contain no more than two courses from the discipline in which the student intends to complete a minor (those one or two courses cannot be used toward completion of the minor).

^{*} Students wishing to continue a previous language taken in high school, should consult with the Department of Modern Languages for an assessment or may start a new language at the elementary level.

^{*} The two semesters must be taken in the same foreign language.
